

### ***What is the UASI Grant?***

- The purpose of the UASI Grant is to provide a primary funding mechanism for building and sustaining national preparedness capabilities.
- The UASI funds are allocated based on DHS risk methodology (next slide) and anticipated effectiveness based on the strength of the Investment Justification.
- The Investment Justifications have to support the Homeland Security Priorities as well as fall into the categories of planning, organization, equipment, training, or exercises.



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

## Examples of Success With the Use of UASI Funds

- Mobile Command Post used at multiple significant events such as races at Daytona, large-scale crime scenes, natural and man-made disasters, NBA All-Star Game, UCF incident just to name a few.
- Urban Search and Rescue (Florida Task Force 4)-membership spans all 9 counties with approximately 21 participating agencies. The Task Force has operated throughout the State of Florida and surrounding states.
- Hazardous Materials Response-6 HazMat Response Teams which include OCFR, OFD, and SCFD. Brevard Co. FD, Lake Co FD, and Volusia Co FD maintain HazMat teams with dedicated equipment and apparatus.
- Full Scale Medical Surge exercise at OIA involving 16 hospitals, approximately 16 LE and FD agencies within the region, state and federal emergency response personnel, private sector components.
- Training such as All Hazards Incident Management Team course (AHIMT), Fire competency training, all types of training in order to be National Incident Management System (NIMS) compliant.
- Central Florida Intelligence Exchange (CFIX), Brevard County has a analyst assigned full time to CFIX.

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Colorado, South Carolina, Texas, and Florida are all recent incidents of Domestic Terrorism.
