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# ECFRPC Council

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The Regional Planning Council is both the body of its elected and appointed representatives and its professional staff. The Council representatives are comprised of local government elected officials and private citizen representatives within the region. Member counties and leagues of cities are responsible for appointing two-thirds of the representatives and the Governor of Florida is responsible for appointing one-third.

Council members establish policies, adopt plans, allocate agency resources, and develop programs to meet regional needs.

The governing body of the Regional Planning Council is comprised of 29 voting members made up of:

- 12 representatives from six counties
- 6 appointees from three leagues of cities
- 1 representative from the largest city in the region (Orlando)
- 10 gubernatorial appointees
- 8 non-voting ex-officio members




# Agency Profile and Mission

The East Central Florida Regional Planning Council (ECFRPC Region 6) was established in 1962 and is one of 11 regional planning councils mandated by the Florida Legislature under the authority of Chapter 186, Florida Statutes.

The Council is a public agency that assists the public, private, and institutional sectors in a six-county area to address regional scale issues. The ECFRPC offers services to the counties of Brevard, Lake, Orange, Osceola, Seminole, and Volusia. This planning area includes three major metropolitan areas, 68 cities, 6,500 square miles, and more than three million people.

Our mission is, “to avoid further sprawl by implementing the 2060 East Central Florida Plan (SRPP)”. The maps below show how a series of small policy shifts can make a dramatic difference over the next 50 years.



Maps were created by the University of Florida GEO Plan Center, Dr. Paul Zwick. The map on the left represents the “Trend 2060” with an additional 1,410,915 urbanized acres (2,205 square miles) from 2005 - 2060. The map on the right represents the “ECFRPC 2060 Plan” with an additional 246,853 urbanized acres (386 square miles) from 2005 - 2060. Both scenarios allocated the same 7.1 million 2060 population.

## 2009 Population Growth

East Central Florida has historically experienced significant population growth, including huge boom years from 2000 through 2006 when the region added approximately 600,000 new residents. Growth slowed in 2007 and out-migration began to exceed in-migration. With job losses in construction and other retrenching industries, population growth stalled and then reversed in 2008 - 2009 showing a net regional population loss for one of the few times in Florida's recent history.

New regional population estimates (B.E.B.R. projections extrapolated to 2060) completed by University of Florida's Dr. Paul Zwick project a 2060 regional population of 7,097,140. This number is lower than the 2050 projection of 7,123,769 estimated by the University of Florida Bureau of Economics and Business and Research (BEBR) in 2006.

East Central Florida Regional Planning Council's bylaws prescribe that annual assessments are tied to the most recent University of Florida B.E.B.R. population estimates. For FY2011, the most recent estimates from B.E.B.R. are April 2009, displayed below.


## Budget and Member Dues

# 2009 Regional Planning Success Stories

- ❖ The first draft of the **East Central Florida 2060 Plan** (Strategic Regional Policy Plan – SRPP) was completed at the end of 2009 and delivered to the ECFRPC Council in January 2010. This is a landmark achievement: the first 50 year regional plan in Florida, implementing the first regional vision in Florida. An update of the SRPP is state mandated every 10 years. The goals and policies contained within the 2060 Plan are intended to set a direction for future growth and change over time. This plan is intended to foster creativity and non-conventional thought processes.



- ❖ The ECFRPC worked with the **City of Cape Canaveral** to complete a community visioning project. 160 citizens determined the strengths, weaknesses, opportunities, and threats in their community in order to establish and implement a shared vision for future development. Visual preference surveys helped citizens conceptualize how their community could look at build out. After the seven month visioning process, the City of Cape Canaveral established a comprehensive vision statement and helped to develop a set of artist renderings of strategically identified opportunity sites and what they could look like at build-out. The city is now proposing regional partnerships with FDOT, Port Canaveral, and Cocoa Beach to apply for funding to implement the vision.




- ❖ **SunRail**, Central Florida’s planned 61.5-mile commuter rail service, was approved by the Florida legislature in 2009. It will travel through four counties from DeLand to Poinciana. As the spine of an integrated regional transportation system endorsed by the 2060 Plan, SunRail is a step to building a more sustainable local economy by reducing vehicle miles traveled and greenhouse gases, and incentivizing dense, mixed use development around rail stops.



- ❖ A training manual, **Connecting the Region with Transit – Implementing the Central Florida Regional Growth Vision**, was prepared through the mutual efforts of the Florida Department of Transportation – District Five, the East Central Florida Regional Planning Council and Kittelson & Associates, Inc. The purpose of the document is to guide local governments how to plan for future transit served corridors and be consistent with the East Central Florida 2060 Plan. - ❖ **Corridor analysis** studies were completed for 12 miles of U.S. 17-92 in 2009 between Maitland Boulevard and Sanford. ECFRPC staff conducted studies that focused on documenting and analyzing current land use patterns. Staff reports identified potentially underutilized parcels and explored land readjustment opportunities that could help revitalize the study area’s local economy. This corridor will get improved transit service connecting to SunRail, making it ripe for redevelopment.



- ❖ The City of Edgewater’s **Restoration** Development of Regional Impact was approved. It is envisioned as a conservation-oriented, yet also compact and urban, transit-oriented, new town. This development, if built, could become the prototype for sustainable new development in the region.



- ❖ On January 29, 2009, the ECFRPC sponsored, in conjunction with others, **“Reclaiming the Commercial Strip & Creating Transit Friendly Communities”**. The workshop featured renowned planner, Randall Arendt and other experts from around the Country. Approximately 200 planners, transportation experts, elected officials, developers, and interested citizens attended the workshop.



- ❖ ECFRPC, the Office of Greenways and Trails, and the Eastcoast Greenway Alliance held **“Trails and the Green: An economic development workshop”** on November 6, 2009. The workshop explained the potential positive impact of trails on economic development, specifically in communities and downtowns.

- ❖ ECFRPC staff worked with the **City of Palm Bay** to plan two public input meetings and charrettes and revise their sign code. Preliminary meetings were held with the City Manger, Planning Manager, and City staff to discuss the current sign code, their concerns, and the objective. ECFRPC provided technical assistance by:

- Creating a city base map
- Creating a map based on the results of the intensity preference survey
- Leading a strengths, weaknesses, opportunities, threats (SWOT) analysis

## Planning and Growth Management – DCA Contract

### Review of Local Government Comprehensive Plans and Plan Amendments



Every local government in the State of Florida is required to have a comprehensive plan to guide future growth and development. Local governments can propose changes to their plan by small and large scale plan amendments. In general, small scale amendments apply to less than ten acres and do not involve text changes to the plan. Local governments are permitted to transmit two large scale comprehensive plan amendments each year. These amendments undergo a more thorough review process than small scale amendments.

One of the Regional Planning Council’s statutory responsibilities is the review of comprehensive plans and plan amendments. This includes:

- Review of plans and plan amendments for consistency with the Strategic Regional Policy Plan (SRPP)
- Review of plans and plan amendments for extra-jurisdictional impacts with the comprehensive plans of affected local governments
- Make recommendations on the necessity of further review by the Department of Community Affairs (DCA), pursuant to Section 163.3184(6)(a), Florida Statutes

Evaluation and Appraisal Reports (EARs) are required every seven years for communities to assess their progress in implementing their plan. EARs are routinely reviewed by staff for consistency with the Strategic Regional Policy Plan.

## Intergovernmental Coordination And Review (ICAR)

The Intergovernmental Coordination and Review Program was initiated by Executive Order No. 12372 signed by President Reagan in 1982, and given direction in Florida by Executive Order No. 83-150 signed by Governor Graham in 1983. The East Central Florida Regional Planning Council reviews and comments on requests for grants and permits from various government agencies.

The reviews fall into three broad categories:

- Grants applications to federal agencies
- Construction permit applications to the Department of Environmental Protection, the South Water Management District, and the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers
- Opportunity to comment on proposed plans and projects

Each application is reviewed for consistency with the Strategic Regional Policy Plan.

## Affordable Housing

The East Central Florida Regional Planning Council (ECFRPC) promotes policies that support a variety of integrated housing choices available to all income levels. Consistent with the Regional Vision, affordable housing options should be available in appropriate locations throughout the region and within close proximity to available infrastructure, transportation options, and job markets. The ECFRPC encourages partner communities to minimize local regulatory barriers and streamline available financial assistance programs to make them more efficient in delivering home ownership. In addition, the ECFRPC explores and recommends appropriate housing alternatives such as linkage fees, the use of by-right accessory dwellings, and inclusionary zoning practices.

Council staff continues to work on building stronger relationships with affordable housing groups and local government in order to provide consistent recommendations and policies when addressing affordable housing needs in development of regional impacts and comprehensive plan reviews.

## Development of Regional Impact (DRI) Reviews

A DRI is defined by Chapter 380.06(1) Florida Statutes as any development which, because of its character, magnitude, or location, would have a substantial effect upon the health, safety or welfare of citizens of more than one county.

The Regional Planning Council coordinates the multi-agency review activities and evaluates the application for consistency with the adopted state and regional plans. The RPC holds a public hearing to adopt recommendations regarding the DRI which are forwarded to the local government.

The RPC is an advisory body to the local government and therefore does not make the final decision to approve or deny the development.

The Florida legislature adopted Senate Bill 360 in 2009 which exempted DRI reviews in most areas that have more than 1,000 residents per square mile (less than one house per acre) and

declared these areas Dense Urban Land Areas (DULAs). For our region, 42 of 74 jurisdictions are now mostly exempted from new DRI review. This legislation, combined with the downturn in the economy, has significantly reduced the amount of DRI reviews during the last year.

It is difficult to predict the future of DRI reviews because there is a glut of current entitled (approved) projects that have yet to be developed. The real estate market is changing during the course of the current real estate recession. It is possible that existing DRIs may wish to change their product line to reflect market shifts. Many low-density residential DRIs located far from job markets may never get built.

As the economy improves, it is expected that the number of DRI reviews, reviews of changes to existing DRIs, and monitoring activities will increase, however it is not expected to return to the level experienced prior to the economic recession.

## Emergency Management and Emergency Preparedness Planning

The East Central Florida Regional Planning Council provides emergency preparedness support to the region. This support is provided through an all-hazards approach to emergency management. The all-hazards approach focuses on developing capacities and capabilities that are critical to preparedness for a full range of emergencies or disasters.

Programs and projects include:

- Local Emergency Planning Committee (LEPC)
- Urban Area Security Initiative (UASI)
- Regional Domestic Security Task Force (RDSTF)
- Statewide Regional Evacuation Study Program



In 2009, the ECFRPC assisted the region in the areas of Hazardous Materials, Homeland Security and Emergency Management planning and training in the following ways:

- Reviewed and updated the Region 5 Tactical Interoperability Communications (TIC) Plan



Additionally, the ECFRPC continued to work with other planning councils and FDEM on the Statewide Regional Evacuation Study. Database files for critical facilities and shelters were updated as well as evacuation routes and other data and coordination for the deliverables of the project. The project will be completed in June 2010.

## Economic Development

The Economic Development program is made up of three parts:

1. Economic Impact Research and Analysis
2. Fiscal Impact Research and Analysis
3. Management of the region's Comprehensive Economic Development Strategy (CEDS), which integrates growth management and economic planning

The ECFRPC region is an Economic Development District approved by the Economic Development Administration (EDA). Council staff developed the region's Comprehensive Economic Development Strategy (CEDS) in 2007. The CEDS promotes regional economic development through public and private sector collaboration in order to stay globally competitive in the 21st century. Included in the region's CEDS is a list of priority projects that would receive preference for federal funding through the EDA.



Staff reviewed grants applications to the Economic Development Administration and provided technical assistance to applicants. We performed the following economic impact (REMI Model) studies:

- Technological Research and Development Authority Technology Based Business Incubator Expansion
- Seminole Community College Center for Business and Entrepreneurship
- Titusville-Cocoa Airport Authority Space Coast Regional Airport project

Staff performed the following economic analyses:

- Seminole County Public Schools System economic impact analysis.
- Seminole County half cent sales tax impact study
- Volusia County economic analysis of the Veterans Memorial Bridge Replacement (Project TIGER)
- Volusia County economic analysis for the widening of State Road 415

Staff also participated in the Regional Aerospace Workforce Initiative and Provided assistance to the workforce agencies in Brevard County and the region to ensure a smooth transition for workers with jobs related to the shuttle program expected to end in 2011.

## Environmental Planning

The ECFRPC is dedicated to the protection and enhancement of our natural resources by the "Natural Resources of Regional Significance" maps and policies in the East Central Florida 2060 Plan. The ECFRPC plans for greenways and trails and scenic byways as part of environmental planning and natural resource management.



In 2009 staff participated in the following environmental planning projects:

### Wekiva River Basin Commission

The Council assists governments in the Wekiva Study Area with the implementation of Wekiva legislation to protect critical habitat in the construction of the Wekiva Parkway. Staff assists the Wekiva River Basin Commission and organizes Commission meetings.

### Office of Greenways and Trails



In conjunction with the Office of Greenways and Trails and the East Coast Greenway Alliance staff organized “Trails and the Green: An economic development workshop” on November 6, 2009. The workshop demonstrated how greenways and trails can spur economic development, revitalize downtowns, and be used for tourism opportunities. Attendees included elected officials, city managers, economic development experts, planners and engineers from the ECFRPC region, as well as Flagler, Marion, and St. Johns counties. Executive Director, Phil Laurien, continues to serve as a Governor’s appointee on the Florida Greenways and Trails Council, and therefore has a vote on state purchase of trail lands.

### Sea Level Rise Studies

ECFRPC staff continues to work with the City of Satellite Beach and the Indian River Lagoon on the Climate Ready Estuaries Grant. Staff assessed facilities in Satellite Beach that may be affected by sea level rise and created a draft map series for the project. Staff presented this information on climate change and sea level rise on a regional level at a public meeting in Satellite Beach.

### Local Trails

ECFRPC staff supports local and regional trail initiatives throughout the region, including the St. Johns River Alliance Trail Subcommittee. Some of staff’s trails tasks in 2009 were:

- Attended the St. Johns River to Sea Loop meeting on May 29, 2009 in DeBary, Florida.
- Worked with Seminole and Lake Counties, the MPOs, FDOT, and the Expressway Authority on issues and opportunities associated with the “Wekiva Trail”. Meetings were held December 14, 2009 and January 26, 2010.
- Attended August 17, 2009 (The agenda consisted of the following topics: Safe Routes to School, the Wekiva Parkway Trail study update, Conservation Trust of Florida and the MetroPlan Orlando interactive bike route web-tool).
- Attended a field trip May 8, 2009 with Osceola County, the cities of Kissimmee and St. Cloud and the Osceola County School Board, the Regional Greenway and Trail Work Group.

## Transportation Planning

Florida Regional Planning Councils are authorized to recommend minimum densities in planned transit corridors. The ECFRPC has done so as part of its Transportation Chapter of the East Central Florida 2060 Plan. When frequent, reliable transit is committed in these corridors, local communities will need to plan for Transit Oriented Development (TOD) to take advantage of the transit asset and to build ridership.



The region must embrace and require mixed uses (residential, commercial, and office) and higher densities along transit corridors and within walking distance of commuter rail stops in order for our multi-modal transportation systems to achieve optimal success. Off street parking requirements should be reduced or abolished in TOD areas.

Each community that changes its comprehensive plan for TOD can be guided by the suggested densities and Floor Area Ratios in the East Central Florida 2060 Plan. Some properties, due to age of structure or lot configuration may need a local special exception to transit-oriented recommended minimum densities but in general TOD will be better served if comprehensive plans embrace the idea of transit corridors with minimum densities, and Floor Area Ratios that exceed 1.0 (as a minimum).

## Mapping and GIS

The ECFRPC offers Geographic Information System (GIS) assistance to local governments and other municipalities that do not have, or have limited, GIS capabilities. Assistance including, but not limited to:

- GIS training
- Preliminary creation of future land-use, conservation, and parks layers
- GIS analysis (underutilization of current corridors and redevelopment potential; wetland; floodplains; critical habitat; etc.)
- Development of base map series for local governments

The GIS Department can do custom spatial analysis for clients, so feel free to inquire what we can do for you.

### Central Florida Geographic Information System (CFGIS)

CFGIS is a program of the ECFRPC developed in partnership with FDOT. Since 2001, CFGIS has been serving 10 counties in Central Florida (Brevard, Flagler, Lake, Marion, Orange, Osceola, Polk, Seminole, Sumter, and Volusia). The program provides GIS professionals and data map users with a forum to communicate and share data. It also provides services in developing spatial mapping applications and modeling analysis for all.

More than 85 percent of the data used by local agencies in their decision-making is geographic in nature. Central Florida Geographic Information Systems (CFGIS) Interactive Tools enable even non-GIS professionals to take advantage of several regional interactive mapping tools. The public can customize maps to display information in a format and scale appropriate to their needs.
